- Ancillary Items:
  - Gazebo still needs repairing Action: Eddie/Richard
- Solar Streets
  - 4 houses in Cranleigh and Ewhurst have participated not enough to be eligible for discount.
  - Solar panels difficult to obtain.
  - Campaign still to continue Action: Alice
- Footpaths
  - o First path between Wykehurst Lane and Coneyhurst Lane has also been cleared.
- Pond and Surroundings
  - o Top of compost needs to be moved during Autumn/Winter. Action: Eddie
  - 2 spare bins for clay and soil one is empty and could be used for compost. Put 'Compost' label on empty one and 'Clay & Soil' on the other Action: Joanna
  - o Inform Horticultural Society of spare compost Action: Joanna
- Ewhurst Carnival
  - It was thought the Recycling option for the Carnival would be most appropriate but Joanna to check with James/Eddie/Richard – Action: Joanna
  - Also contact James/Eddie/Richard to sort out details Action: Joanna
  - Main problem probably organising removal of recycling.
- Big Help Out Day
  - Great success good turnout for both the Litter Pick and the Tree Planting.

- Bring & Take Morning
  - It was considered that LEAP would not continue this as the reduction of the opening times for the Recycling site in Cranleigh has led to a more rubbish items being brought in which then have to be disposed of by LEAP.
- Saturday Work Parties
  - o It was discussed whether to experiment with different days and times for the Saturday work parties which, since Covid, have been attracting fewer volunteers.
  - Possibly have longer and larger work parties less often and at a time which suits more volunteers. – Action: All
  - o It was recognised that LEAP needs to organise more prominent events.
  - Advertise with posters Action: Claire/Joanna
- Sayers Croft Garden for the Disabled
  - It was suggested LEAP could become involved with this initiative and look at a possible joint venture for future events.
